Results. Propose here the main results that you obtained. If you want to list an enumeration, respect

the following presentation: (1) first fact; (2) second fact; and (3) last fact. Do not propose tables and/or

figures. Focus on the most important findings that your study pointed out. Statistical analysis should be

proposed when available with the usual level of significance (p<0.05). When you present one project,

it would be necessary to provide here all details that would be important in order to understand how it

works and what the informal effects are. This section should be the bigger one as you are expected to

provide as much information as possible within the abstract's length requirement that is 300 words for

any submission. The scientific committee will assess carefully the form and content of your abstract.

Conclusions. In this section, select the main aspects that you want to emphasize as well as the

practical implications that your study has. Do not forget the potential limits of your work.
